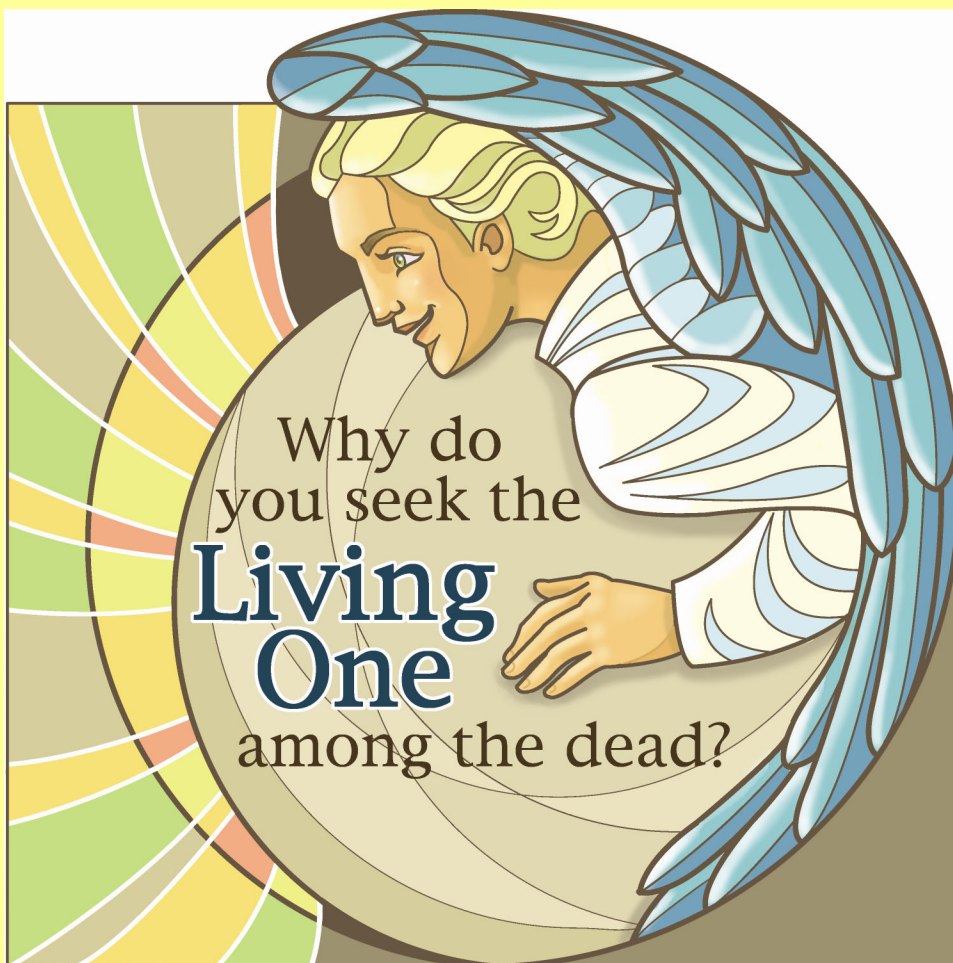

EXPECT THE UNEXPECTED

We all know what to expect of Easter: lots of lilies around the altar, our “Alleluia” joyfully sung over and over, perhaps a tasty ham dinner later in the day, topped off by some chocolates from the Easter basket. But all of this began, as we hear in today’s Gospel, with the “unexpected” when Mary Magdalene found the tomb empty. Indeed, Peter’s speech from Acts in the first reading could insert the phrase “you might have expected” at a number of points . . . that Jesus would baptize John, not the other way around . . . that his healing and exorcising ministry would win him acclaim, not death . . . that his resurrection would place him in another dimension, not back at table with his followers. On a day like Easter, a day filled with traditions, customs, and expectations, we are called more than ever to keep looking for God’s will in unexpected places, people, and events. In this way we can continue to give witness, like Mary Magdalene and Peter, that Christ is truly risen from dead, and continues to live among us.

What can we do to participate in the Catholic Campaign for Immigration Reform?

1. Prayer. You may not be able to actively participate in the campaign but you can pray.

2. You can participate in the April 10-11 masses that will be dedicated to the Catholic Campaign for Immigration Reform.

3. You can participate in the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' Justice for Immigrants Postcard Campaign during the month of April. By signing the postcard asking for improvement of the immigration system.

5. You can talk with your family and friends about the position of the Church about this issue, and advocate for it.

THE BODY OF CHRIST HAS AIDS:

IF ONE OF US IS INFECTED, ALL OF US ARE AFFECTED

"The spread of HIV can be controlled by lasting changes in the ways people act ... People need education and motivation, so they will choose wisely and well. Providing information that is both accurate and appropriate is a logical and necessary starting point... Educational programs and public information campaigns ... must provide convincing assurances that something can be done to prevent infection -that the changes in behavior that are being recommended are possible and will do some good" - US. Conference of Catholic Bishops: Called to Compassion and Responsibility

How can we prevent HIV infection? *Part 11*

3. Avoid sharing any skin cutting-piercing-tattooing instruments, such as blades, needles and syringes. When sharing such instruments cannot be avoided, insist that they be sterilized.

4. In the case of HIV infection in one or both partners, couples should seek medical advice, especially if contemplating pregnancy, because of the possibility of passing the virus to their baby.

5. If you are sexually active, know your status, get tested.

6. Although not all methods -such as condoms- are approved by the Catholic Church we have to realize that not everyone is willing or able to follow our norms. But we can still make a difference by raising awareness and talking about HIV /AIDS.
