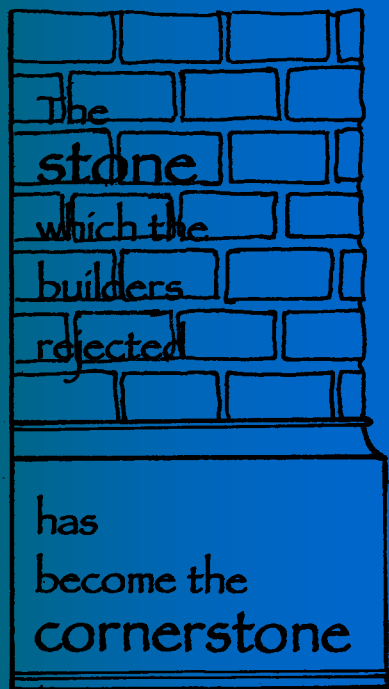

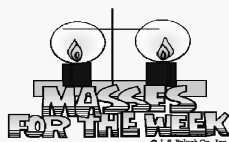

SAVED BY THE ONE WHO WAS REJECTED

Some city teenagers often scorn and reject farm kids. Yet it's no exaggeration to say that humanity owes its life to farmers who care for the world's crops and livestock. This week's scriptures remind us that Jesus was as rejected as a shepherd, a farm boy, yet we owe our very lives to him.



In this Sunday's reading from the Acts of the Apostles Peter tells the people that salvation comes through Jesus Christ, the one who was rejected. In John's letter we hear that we have become God's beloved children through Jesus, whom the world did not know. Lastly, in the Gospel Jesus describes himself as the Good Shepherd who "lays down his life for the sheep" (John 10:11). Will you join Jesus in laying down your life for God's beloved flock?

ST. JEAN MARIE VIANNEY: PATRON SAINT OF ALL PRIESTS

VATICAN CITY, 16 MAR 2009 (VIS)

“Faithfulness of Christ, faithfulness of priests” is the theme of the Year for Priests announced in March 2009 by the Holy Father, according to a communiqué issued by the Holy See Press Office.

The Pope will inaugurate the Year on 19 June, presiding at Vespers in St. Peter’s Basilica where the relics of the saintly ‘Cure of Ars’ will be brought for the occasion by Bishop Guy Bagnard of Belley-Ars, France. He will close the year on 19 June 2010, presiding at a “World Meeting of Priests” in St. Peter’s Square.

During the course of the Year, Benedict XVI will proclaim St. Jean Marie Vianney as patron saint of all the priests of the world. A “Directory for Confessors and Spiritual Directors” will also be published, as will a collection of texts by the Supreme Pontiff on essential aspects of the life and mission of priests in our time.

The Congregation for the Clergy, together with diocesan ordinaries and superiors of religious institutes, will undertake to promote and co-ordinate the various spiritual and pastoral initiatives which are being organized to highlight the role and mission of the clergy in the Church and in modern society, and the need to intensify the permanent formation of priests, associating it with that of seminarians.

God, our Father, we turn to you in this time of great need. We trust in your loving kindness and ask you to hear the prayers we offer for your Church. Through your grace, we seek men to generously offer their lives to you in the vocation of priesthood. We seek both men and women who may offer their lives to you in the vocation of religious life. Bless and guide those who are discerning your call to holiness and service. Give them courage, steadfast love and a spirit of charity as they seek to respond faithfully to the call to priesthood and religious life. We offer this prayer for the Diocese of Orlando and for the whole Church in the name of your Son, Jesus Christ, who is Lord, forever and ever. Amen.

17th Annual NALC National Food Drive

On May 9, the second Saturday in May, letter carriers in more than 10,000 cities and towns throughout the country will deliver much more than the mail along their postal routes; they will also collect the goodness and compassion of their postal customers during the 17th Annual Nat'l. Assoc. of Letter Carriers National Food Drive.

This annual effort has become the largest one-day food drive in the nation's history, resulting in the delivery of nearly half a billion pounds of food to community food banks and pantries. Last year in Marion County, a record 184,000 pounds of non-perishable food was collected and donated to Interfaith Emergency Services for distribution to the Salvation Army, Brothers Keeper, St. Theresa's Catholic Church and the Help Agency of the Forest food banks. **Please hang a food donation on your mailbox on Saturday, May 9. 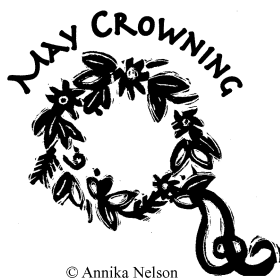

Karen's group will be traveling to Alabama to visit EWTN, the Eternal Word Television Network, established by Mother Angelica in 1981.

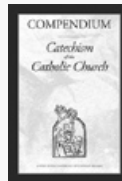

Compendium Corner

#230. For what reason are the sacraments necessary for salvation?

For believers in Christ the sacraments, even if they are not all given to each of the faithful, are necessary for salvation because they confer sacramental grace, forgiveness of sins, adoption as children of God, conformation to Christ the Lord and membership in the Church. The Holy Spirit heals and transforms those who receive the sacraments.

#231. What is sacramental grace?

Sacramental grace is the grace of the Holy Spirit which is given by Christ and is proper to each sacrament. This grace helps the faithful in their journey toward holiness and so assists the Church as well to grow in charity and in her witness to the world.
