**OPEN TO GOD'S WORD**

Today the Church begins a stretch of Ordinary Time that will last for five months. The liturgical vigor of the Easter Season and the feasts of the Holy Trinity and the Body and Blood of Christ settles down into this long stretch that opens before us. During Ordinary Time the life of Christ is broken open for us by one of the Gospel writers. This year we have been hearing the Gospel of Saint Mark. We begin this week by listening to his account of the Lord Jesus calming the stormy seas. Through this miracle Jesus tests the faith of his followers. As we settle into Ordinary Time let us be open to the power of the word of God to effect change within us. Let us pray that our faith will be strengthened as we grow more and more into faithful disciples.

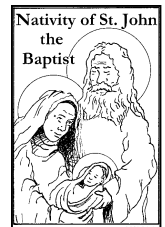

**PARISH PASTORAL LIFE****“THANK YOU . . . JUST ISN'T ENOUGH”**

Many, many, years ago when our St. Theresa Parish initiated the Social Service Department Constitution and Bye-Laws, the directions of our St. Theresa Ecumenical Soup Kitchen and Food Pantry were scripted. Funds for groceries, paper products and anything relating to the Soup Kitchen and Food Pantry Operation MUST come from area donors and from our donation box. This is how we live . . . . The life of our Soup Kitchen and Food pantry starts in the wee hours of the morning. Our many Pick-up drivers start from home before 5:00 picking up food from Publix in Lady Lake, Publix on Rt. 42, Publix in Belleview, Sweetbay, KFC and Pizza Hut, all this on a daily basis. From there the items are delivered to our Soup Kitchen for marking and sorting by our wonderful volunteers. Yes . . . That early!! The next route for these items are designated points of sharing. They either flow to the Soup Kitchen for our daily Menu or placed in our Food Pantry for our Daily Clients. Throughout the day our Soup Kitchen and Food Pantry receive donations of either left over items from dinners from area communities such as Del Webb and their wonderful Kitchen Club or one of their other Clubs, Stone Crest, SummerGlenn, Spruce Creek South or one of the many other Village Community Clubs, or of groceries which they collect at their weekly group meetings. In addition our weekly Food Pantry receives items from ST. John's Lutheran, St. Timothy's, and St. Mark's the Evangelical Church. Many of these also continue to donate Monetary Collections to help us meet the needs of items we don't receive but are much need via donations.

Words, cannot express, our Gratitude for the Generosity shared by all. We on a continual basis send them You Notes and try out best to reach out to the Communities and Organizations to let them know how much they are helping our St. Theresa's Ministry to the Poor, but sometimes our Hearts are so Filled with Love and Gratitude that we want to make sure our Message of Thanks is received properly.

The above mentioned Organizations and Churches (if I have missed any . . I truly apologize) also contribute of themselves via volunteering. The hours and work they perform is immeasurable. Please know you are all “Treasured and are TRULY PRICELESS.”

Time and Time again, I walk the grounds with wonder, as I watch the clients eating their meals or picking up their food and see the Lords Work in Action. What more can one say . . . “WE SINCERELY THANK YOU!”


