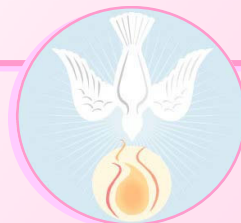

GRADUATION ADDRESS

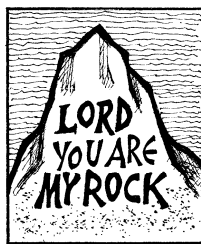
In this season of graduations, we have an ancient model for a brilliant graduation address. Moses exhorts the people of Israel to take the words of God—the commandments—to heart and make an earnest effort to pass them on to succeeding generations. This message applies to us as well. Superficial knowledge of the Lord’s words will not do. To say over and over “Lord, Lord!” or “Yes, Lord!” while doing nothing is all too common, even today.



And Paul does not contradict Moses when he says that we are justified by faith apart from observance of the law. If we have faith in the Lord, then we love the Lord. Out of that love we will want to know God’s will and act in accord with God’s every word. Jesus’ great love for us brings justification entirely out of proportion to the sins of those who have faith in the Lord and try to keep God’s word.

Parishioner's Reflection . . .

Doing the Will of the Father—Enter the Kingdom of heaven.

To do the Father's Will first calls us to know who the Father is and to have a relationship with the Father. Through Scripture, through the Sacraments and in prayer we can grow closer to the Father and come to know Him. We can not know what someone wants from us if we are not familiar with that person. How did you know what was expected of you from your parents, teachers or a boss except through communication directly and indirectly? How is your communication with the Father? Do you spend time in prayer and in silence?

What does the Father want us to do? What is His Will for us? He wants us to stay close to Him, "and my Father is the vine grower....Remain in me, as I remain in you. Just as a branch cannot bear fruit on its own unless it remains on the vine, so neither can you unless you remain in me." John 15:1-4. In what ways do you remain close to God?

God sends us holy people to be living examples of how to do the Father's Will. St. Theresa of Lisieux chose to do the Father's Will in small ways with deep love and devotion to God. Mother Teresa chose to do the Father's Will in small ways with great love to the poorest of the poor and the sickest of the sick in our world. I would suggest renting the movie "*Entertaining Angels*", the story of Dorothy Day to see the struggles and blessings that come along with doing the Father's Will and, if you like to read, I suggest, "*Jesus Freaks*", stories of those who died for Jesus, written by dcTalk.




May we continue to be inspired to do the Will of the Father here at St. Theresa's, in our homes, with our families, and in our neighborhoods.

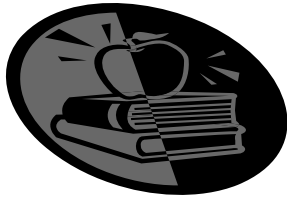

The Mystery of the Holy Shroud: The Case for Authenticity

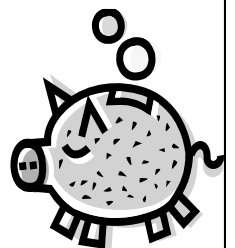
